Universal Periodic Review of Indonesia

Intervention by the delegation of Liechtenstein

Liechtenstein welcomes the distinguished delegation of Indonesia and wishes to thank for the valuable information provided in the introductory statement and in the national report.

Liechtenstein is concerned by the continued imposition of the **death penalty**, mostly for drug-related offenses - crimes that do not meet the threshold of "most serious crimes" and are thus prohibited by the ICCPR. **Liechtenstein strongly recommends to Indonesia to end this practice.**

Liechtenstein recommends that Indonesia accede to the Rome Statute as amended at the Review Conference in Kampala in 2010 and align its national legislation with the obligations under the Rome Statute, the definition of crimes and principles, including the crime of aggression.

Liechtenstein recommends that Indonesia strengthen its legislation on violence against women, including by penalizing all forms of sexual violence.

Liechtenstein recommends that Indonesia take the necessary measures to guarantee the proper functioning of a juvenile justice system including, inter alia, by treating minors in a manner appropriate to their age and that Indonesia abolish all corporal punishment of children in all settings.
